Learning Overviews

Autumn 1 – 2024

We want to ensure that all children learn through a rich, exciting, and engaging curriculum.

Please have a look through to discover an overview of your child's learning for this term.

In Maths we are focussing on learning 1, 2 and 3, focusing on what they look like and what they are made up of.

We will teach subitising and we will count with 1:1 correspondence.

Personal, social, emotional development

This half-term is all about forming positive relationships with their new teachers and classmates.

We shall support taking turns and sharing resources.

We will be learning how to follow the class and school rules.

Physical Development

This term, children will be looking at how to negotiate spaces safely. They will use a variety of tools effectively, including pencil, scissors, and cooking

equipment.

They will begin to form some letters correctly. Theu will start to learn how to take care of their own belongings and develop their independence when dressing and undressing.

Understanding the World

The children will get to talk about memorable past events in their own lives and how to prepare for a party.

They will begin to know about similarities and differences between themselves and others and among families and communities.

Ladybirds Class

Year R – Autumn 1

Ladybirds tend not to follow a topic and each week will be planned around their interests or of an important event. Planning will be adapted to meet the needs of the cohort.

English

This half term, children will be introduced to all the first single letter sounds in phonics. They will link sounds to letters and listen out for initial sounds in words. They will be taught how to orally blend and read three sound words. Children will spend this half term learning how to write their name and writing simple words using their phonics knowledge.

Expressive Art and Design

This half term is all about mark making and mixing colours.

We will create some self-portraits.

Children will also be hearing lots of stories and have opportunities to act out and create stories with classmates using a range of resources such as story spoons, story pebbles or dressing up.

RE

Throughout RE, the children will be exploring how we are all special. We will look at what things are special to each other and how they can be the same and different to one another.

PE

During our outdoor PE lessons, we will be learning how to use tricycles safely. Inside PE we will be using bar equipment climbing, jumping and balancing.

Communication and Language

Developing good listening skills is key which we will practise in small groups. We will learn how to follow instructions and practise speaking clearly to our classmates.

In Maths, we will be focusing on Number and Place Value to start with, looking at representing number using objects, pictures and different representations. We will explore ordering numbers and comparing numbers, before moving on to learning and recalling our number bonds to 10 and 20.

<u>PSHE</u>

"Get Heartsmart!"

We will explore how our choices affect others and how we can feel different emotions. We will begin to identify people that we are grateful for, as well as discuss healthy choices for our minds and our bodies.

Computing

This half term, we will be focusing on using the software, "Paint", on the laptops. We will generate ideas of what to create on Paint relating to our topic and become familiar with the Paint tools we could use. We will also be introduced to how to be safe when using the laptops.

Music "Toys"

We will be exploring dynamic and tempo this half term. We will listen and respond to recordings and then get creative making our own toy music.

<u>Geography</u>

"Would you prefer to live in a hot or cold place?" We will be learning and recalling the location of the seven continents, the North and South Poles, and the equator. We will compare similarities and differences between the weather in the UK and other parts of the world, before using all our knowledge to justify why we would prefer to live in a particular place.

> Chestnut Class Year 1/2 – Autumn 1 **Changes**

<u>English</u>

This half term, we will be focusing on becoming familiar with traditional tales. First, we will look at the stories based on Little Red Riding Hood and specifically look at the version by Lari Don. We will be writing a WANTED poster to describe the wolf, after building vocabulary and writing noun phrases or expanded noun phrases. We will then look at stories based on Rapunzel. We will explore what is the same and different about them, before changing the story ourselves and writing our own innovate narratives!

<u>Science</u>

We will be learning all about "Seasonal Changes". We will be recalling what we already know about the weather, exploring how the day length changes from season to season, and monitoring the weather across the weeks using our outdoor windsocks, rain gauges and thermometer.

<u>RE</u>

Our theme this half term will be "Belonging and Protection" with specific focus on the Hindu festival "Raksha Bandhan". We will learn about what protection means to us as well as to Hindus.

<u>PE</u>

We will begin this year in outdoor PE by exploring and creating different games. In indoor PE, we will focus on locomotion. We will be specifically focusing on our dodging skills.

<u>Art</u>

We will be learning all about the artist "Georgia O'Keeffe" and her artwork. We will explore using different media and mark-making techniques, as well as primary and secondary colours, before making our own art piece inspired by her.

In Maths, we are going to begin by focusing on number and place value, particularly on how numbers to 100 (Yr2) or 1000 (Yr3) can be represented as hundreds, tens and ones through different representations. We will learn to identify 1,10 or 100 more or less than a number. We will focus on adding and subtracting within 20 using known number facts and using related facts up to 100. We will apply our learning to money and measurement.

Computing

In computing this half-term, children will be learning about e-safety. Knowing what to do if they access inappropriate content online and learning to question the validity of what they see on the internet. They will be practising their wordprocessing skills beginning to type with 2 hands.

<u>Music</u>

The children will begin by listening to music by Edvard Greig called "In the Hall of the Mountain King". The children will explore duration and the gradual increases of dynamics and tempo and its effect on the character and mood of music. They will compose their own rhythms within a simple structure, performing them with gradual changes of dynamics and tempo and recording their ideas using traditional notation.

Geography

The children will be finding out which Biome they would most like to live in. They will begin finding what a Biome is and then get their hands dirty in our local woods identifying plants and animals to find out which biome we live in. They will then go on a journey to different biomes such as deserts and grasslands before doing a design task to promote their favourite biome.

> Hazel Class Year 2/3 – Autumn 1 **Brilliant Biomes**

English

In Guided Reading the children will be reading 'The Whisperer' by Nick Butterworth and 'Hampsted the Hamster' by Michael Rosen. Across the week they will learn and use new vocabulary, practise fluency when reading and answer questions from what they have read.

In English they will be focusing on diary and narrative writing. Year 2 children will be using co-ordinating conjunctions (e.g. but, and) to link their ideas. They will be including noun phrases to add interest to their writing. Year 3 children will be learning to organise their writing into chunks and will use a range of sentence structures. They will learn to use inverted commas for speech.

PSHE

The children will be introduced to our new Heart Smart programme. They will consider how what is in our hearts is played out in our words and actions. They will identify special people to them and how they show them love.

<u>RE</u>

The children will explore the meaning of rituals. They will begin by identifying rituals that they are familiar with in their own lives e.g. lighting candles on a birthday cake. Then they will be finding out about Sukkot in the Jewish faith and the significance of ritual in this religious celebration.

<u>PE</u>

During our outdoor PE lessons, they will be developing skills within the context of invasion games. They will be introduced to passing, receiving, moving and begin shooting and scoring.

In our indoor PE lessons, the children will be exploring their own health and wellbeing. The focus is on identifying how we feel in our minds and in our bodies. They will learn a variety of relaxation techniques through activities focussing on breathing and balance.

<u>Art</u>

This half-term the children will be painting. They will be mixing colours, using primary colours to create secondary colours. They will be using black/ white paint to change the tint of a colour. They will be exploring the work of Vincent Van Gogh and creating texture in their own painting.

In Maths will we start with the place value of 4digit numbers and learning about negative numbers. We will then practice a range of written and mental methods for addition and subtraction. Afterwards, we will relate addition and subtraction to measurement, money and length. Throughout the term, we will be consolidating our multiplication and division knowledge.

<u>History</u>

We will investigate the role of an archaeologist in discovering about life in the past. We will find out what evidence has been discovered at Calleva Atrebatum and what this tells us about life in this Roman town. We will begin to understand the impact of Roman occupation on the existing British inhabitants, how Silchester developed over time and what happened when the Romans left Britain

<u>Science</u>

In Science, we will be learning about the phases of matter – what are the properties of solids, liquids and gases? How do particles behave inside solids, liquids and gases? what happens when you heat or cool each state of matter? How can we measure the melting and boiling points of a substance? Which substances do not fit into one state of matter?

<u>RE</u>

Purim - We will discover the meaning of *identity* and how Jews express the concept of *identity* at Purim. We will discuss the value of identity for their own lives and communities and describe how their *identity* affects theirs and others' lives.

<u>PE</u>

In PE, we will be learning how to play basketball and undertake various teamwork and team building activities to help develop effective team cooperation and communication.

<u>Spanish</u>

In Spanish we will learn to follow basic classroom instructions and name items of classroom equipment in Spanish. We will also learn numbers to 100 in Spanish.

<u>Art</u>

In art we will be looking at the work of Georgia O'Keeffe. We will mix colours and create tints. We will investigate brush size and how to use them effectively to create textures.

PSHE and RSE

Get Heartsmart! - We will discuss ways to show love and to consider the consequence of words. We will consider trust and who to trust, as well as exploring family life. We will explore what affects mental health and will reflect how we care for our hearts.

Computing

E-safety – we will discuss social networking sites and features built into other platforms.

Knowledge of computing – We will learn to navigate to a blog and to understand that it can be updated from a range of devices. We will investigate a variety of blogs and discuss what would be appropriate on a class blog.

<u>Music</u>

The children will explore different rhythm patterns in different metres and will learn to read and compose their own grid notations. They will perform a 4-beat pattern and listen and respond to a song. Sycamore Class Year 4 – Autumn 1 **Why are we called Silchester?**

<u>English</u>

We will firstly be reading *Winter's Child* by Angela McAllister and writing a character description. We will learn how to use expandednoun phrases to add description. We will then read part of *Harry Potter and the Chamber of Secrets* by J. K. Rowling and develop our letter writing skills. In guided reading, we will read The *Wild Robot* by Peter Brown and *Cinnamon* by Neil Gaiman, Using these books, we will identify main ideas drawn from more than one paragraph, discuss words that capture our interest and develop our retrieval and inference skills. Handwriting and spellings will be practiced weekly.

In Maths this half term we are developing our understanding of place value to help us to read, write, order and compare larger numbers. We develop our fluency of mental methods of calculation and apply these skills to measuring and calculating the area and perimeter of composite shapes. We will learn the vocabulary of prime numbers, prime factors and composite numbers.

<u>PSHE</u>

This half-term is all about developing positive relationships. We will look at how to navigate the ups and downs in friendships and qualities in ourselves and others that will help us through difficult times. We will also understand how the choices we make can impact on others and how to seek advice and help if we feel unhappy or unsafe.

Computing

In computing this half-term, we will be developing skills in using the internet for research purposes. We will be able to explain what a search engine is and how to use them effectively. We will also understand that not everything online we see is true and be able to recognise what to check for.

<u>Music</u>

In Music this half term we will identify and explore the minor key and describe how it influences musicians. We use the minor key to compose our own pieces based on frozen landscapes.

Geography

In Geography this half term we will be asking the question 'Where does our energy come from?' We will research renewable and non-renewable energy sources, where they come from and their impact on society, the economy and the environment. Throughout the topic we will be discussing the benefits and drawbacks of each type of energy and the best ways to generate energy.

Beech Class

Year 5 – Autumn 1

Where does our energy come

<u>English</u>

Our writing will focus on utilising a range of our Year 5 writing skills for a variety of purposes. We will begin by using a picture called 'The Whale' and look at news reports of the Loch Ness Monster to generate our own news reports. Following on from this, the children will be researching extraordinary women from past and present through the text 'Good Night Stories for Rebel Girls' to plan and write their own biographies.

In guided reading, we will be reading the text 'Everest' and sharing the book 'The Polar Bear Explorers Club' as well as looking a range of other texts such as poetry and information texts.

<u>Science</u>

Throughout our science unit this half term we will be developing our understanding of materials and their properties We will learn about reversible and irreversible changes. We will work scientifically by writing methods, making predictions and analysing our results. We will identify the types of variables in order to be able to make sure a test is fair.

<u>RE</u>

In RE we reflect on the concept of community (Umma) and what it means to Muslims. We will explain how Muslims develop a sense of belonging and connection across the world. We will evaluate how community affects our own lives and the lives of others and the impact we have on it.

<u>PE</u>

During our outdoor PE lessons, we will learn the rules of hockey and develop ball control skills as well as our attacking and defending skills. In our indoor PE lessons, we learn how to develop our individual fitness and ways to stay fit and healthy.

<u>Spanish</u>

This half term we will be revisiting and developing basic Spanish conversational skills as well as learning the names of animals that can been seen at the zoo and ways of describing them.

In maths we will be learning to read, write, order, and compare numbers to 100,000. We will be looking at adding and subtracting numbers both mentally and with written methods. We will also be learning to use written methods of multiplication and applying these to finding the areas of different rectangles.

Music

We will consider and respond to 'Short Ride in a Fast Machine by John Adams. We will explore the composer's use of a steady beat, rhythm patterns and the structure of the music before using these to inspire original compositions.

<u>PSHE</u>

We will be learning to resolve conflict through negotiation and compromise. We will also learn about respect and develop an understanding that everyone deserves to be respected.

Computing

We will be considering how important it is to stay safe online and identify a range of ways to report concerns about content.

<u>Geography</u>

We will consider the climate of mountain ranges and why people chose to visit The Alps. We will look at Innsbruck and the human and physical features that attract tourists. We will investigate tourism in the local area and compare it to that in The Alps.

Oak Class Year 6 – Autumn 1 What is life like in The Alps?

English

Our writing will focus on utilising a range of our writing skills for a variety of purposes. We will begin by looking at The Way Home and creating some persuasive writing as well as narratives. Following this, the children will read extracts from Street Child and using this as a basis for report writing. In reading, we will be analysing different types of texts such as poetry and information.

<u>Art</u>

We will look at a Frida Kahlo's work and compare this to other artists self-portraits. The children will then create their own self-portrait in the style of Frida.

Science

We will look at the pathway pf light. How shadows change when we manipulate the light source. We will investigate how a periscope works followed by making our own and conveying messages in a 'trench'. Finally, we will investigate what affects the angle of the reflected ray.

RE

We will be discussing The Kingdom of God and looking at what kind of King the bible tells us Jesus was.

<u>PE</u>

During our outdoor PE lessons, we will be learning to develop the use of attacking and defensive play in invasion games.

In our indoor PE lessons, the children will be developing their individual fitness through a variety of fitness circuit activities.

<u>Spanish</u>

We will be revisiting and practising the Spanish phrases and conversation we have learnt so far.
